SOCIALISTS CONVERTED

The American Socialists, who used
to talk so glibly of a coming revolution
in America, now present the edifying
spectacle of a revolution in their
own ranks. It is a patriotic revolution,
which all good Americans, Socialists
and anti-Socialists alike, can
regard with approval.

The most enlightened leaders of
American Socialism broke away from
the party early in the war, because
of its offensive pro-German attitude.
But the rank and file seemed to re-
main under German influence. Now
the spell is broken. A great mass
meeting of Socialists in New York
last week pledged its support to the
allied cause, voiced its approval of
our government's policy and urged
that all Socialists in America unite
in support of the war.

The meeting expressly demanded
that the National Socialist party call
its executive committee together and
nullify the manifesto of its St. Louis
convention, which declared the war
against Germany "the most unjust
in history." It resolved that "So-
cialists everywhere, conscious of their
full duty to their brothers in Russia,
must place themselves now in the
vanguard of a holy crusade against
the mad dogs of Europe."

Germany's treatment of Russia has
thus aroused even the American So-
cialists to the Prussian peril. They
ought to have seen it from the be-
ginning. But their conversion to
Americanism—or, as one of their
leaders puts it—their conversion to
Socialism, is welcome even at this
late hour.

First Germany dreamed of "Berlin
to Bagdad." Then she dreamed of
"Berlin to Vladivostok." And now
Japan's busy with a dream of "Vlad-
ivostok to Berlin."

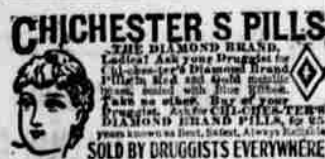

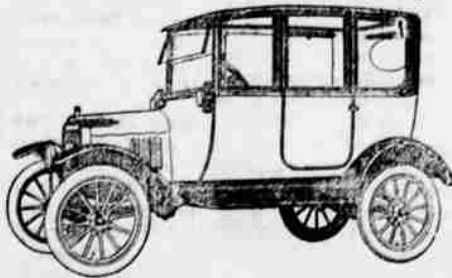

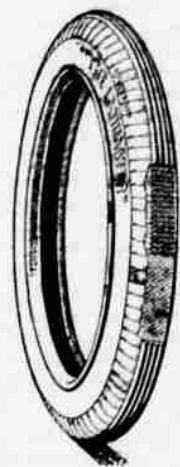
