THAT RUSSIAN MENACE

The world has hardly begun yet to understand the real nature of Russia and the real meaning of Russia's recent behavior. The New York Tribune makes an impressive comment on one phase of it that has received little attention, the "Russian menace."

That menace was supposed to apply particularly to Germany. It will be recalled that German apologists devoted their energies during the summer of 1914 to explaining that Germany was absolutely compelled to go to war in self-defense against the great Slav peril on her Eastern border. It was a clash of two systems, two cultures, Germany must subdue Russia or Russia would destroy Germany. The same argument had been employed for many years to justify Germany's growing armament.

Even since the revolution broke the back of Russian autocracy—the only thing that anybody outside of Russia ever had to fear from that country—Germany has kept harping on the Russian menace. She has now plunged her dripping sword deeper into Russia's vitals with the continued pretense of self-defense.

Well, the Russian menace is pitifully broken. And as it lies there prone and hurt, we shall all begin for the first time to realize what it was. It was not what anybody thought it was. It was not the "bear that walked like a man." It was not the Frankenstein monster Germany imagined it to be. It was all the time the most naive, wisest and confiding human thing in the whole world.

To the end it believed in the German people. Its attempts to touch their hearts and souls, even on the battlefield, with a crooning of freedom and fraternity, will be eternally pathetic. And when it had failed in this, and with a gesture of infinite contempt turned its back and started home, refusing either to fight or to sign an impossible treaty of peace, in that moment it produced one of the gorgeous pictures of this war, one that will be the despair of historians.

No German could understand it. A German does not know what non-resistance means. It may be trickery, cowardice or hypocrisy, or all three together; he takes the coat also and smites the other cheek, and then demands for himself indemnities.

After all the bitter injuries Germany had inflicted on the Russian people, when it came to the test those Russian people revealed, instead of the imagined menace, nothing in the world but the spirit of Christian forgiveness and brotherly love. And even in that Germany saw or professed to see, a German peril.

Why? The answer is inevitable: Because Germany today is not Christian, but pagan.

Germany's greatest ally is the false belief in the United States that the war will be short. Face the grim facts. Prepare in your own home, in your business and in your community for a long, determined struggle. That's the only way to shorten the war and do your full part towards winning it.

POTATOES FOR PATRIOTISM

By eating potatoes instead of wheat the people of the United States can help win the war. We have not enough wheat for the allies and ourselves if we are to continue at our normal rate of consumption. We have an abundance of potatoes. Wheat flour is a concentrated food and therefore good for shipping; potatoes are bulky and are consequently not suited for limited shipping space, nor are the allies so short of potatoes as of wheat. Next to cereals, potatoes have been in this country the mainstay of starchy food; which supplies energy.

The more potatoes we eat, the less wheat we need. A medium-sized potato weighing about three and one-half ounces supplies about as much starch as two small slices of wheat bread one-half inch thick. In other respects also, the potato measures up well with wheat bread and even has the advantage over it in supplying certain salts which the body needs to counteract the acidity resulting from the use of such foods as cereals, meat and eggs. By exercising her ingenuity the housewife can prepare potatoes in many different attractive ways—thus increasing their proportion in the family diet and conserving wheat needed for shipment. An important use of potatoes also is in the mixing of breads, in which mashed potatoes up to fully ten per cent may be used without detracting either from its taste or appearance; in fact, many persons insist that potatoes properly mixed in bread, improves both appearance and flavor.

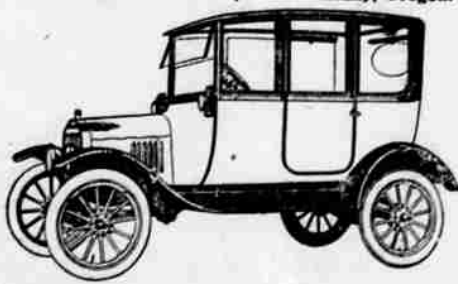

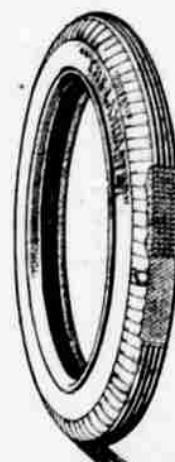
