WILL HE?

"I am a member of a church whose
creed and principles forbid its mem-
bers to participate in war in any form,
and whose religious convictions are
against war or participation there-
in."

These words are the explanation
made by an Oregon farmer of his re-
fusal to buy Thrift Stamps.

This is a country of free conscience
and free worship. May it ever so
remain!

But the Hun army is driving west-
ward. The ambition of its masters is
to dominate the world by military
power. On this point there is no long-
er room for doubt.

Therefore, America, in this war, is
trying to blot out conquest and rule
by arms and armed men. We are
striving to destroy militarism, root
and branch. Our endeavor is to bring
the world into final and lasting peace.
The end this churchman farmer seeks
is the end America is fighting for. It
is an end that cannot be attained by
prayer alone. The Kaiser will not
permit it to be attained other than
by the sword, because he is striving
by the sword to continue here on
earth a military establishment and a
kind of government that will permit
him and his kind to draw the sword
at will, annex territory at will, sub-
jugate peoples at will, ultimately ex-
tending dominion over all people, the
Oregon farmer with conscientious
scruples against war, included.

All this will come to pass in time,
will come to pass just as sure as the
sun continues to shine, if the allies
fail to get a military decision in the
present war. If this war is not won,
and won decisively, there will be other
wars, and then other wars. If
Kaiserism is not thoroughly beaten,
the Oregon farmer will hand down a
legacy of wars and more wars to his
children. With the passions, the
tragedies of barbarism, the travail,
the suspicion and the horrible disclo-
sures of this conflict in the world's
mind and memory, there can never be
permanent peace until the ideas and
ambitions and doctrines of kaiserism
and Hunism are exterminated by force.

Prayer has its place. But junker-
dom is beyond the reach of it. Junk-
erdum is under the leadership of the
devil. We can trust in God while
fighting it, but we must keep our
powder dry.

Will this Oregon farmer permit his
countrymen to do all this struggling
for a world of peace, and he do nothing?
Will he, without lifting his
hand to aid them, take for himself
and for his children and their child-
ren the protection for which his neigh-
bors and countrymen are giving up
everything, even life itself?

Will he plant his feet on his church
relation and accept the protection of
his country, accept the life that the
soil of his country sustains, accept
the privileges that his country throws
around him and his church while his
neighbors and his countrymen bare
their bosoms and give their bodies and
their money to defend his country and
its institutions against the devilish
purposes of the unsparring Hun?

Finally, the war raised the price of
this Oregon farmer's wheat to above
\$2 a bushel. Since he refuses to buy
Thrift Stamps because he says it will
be participation in war, will he sell
his wheat at the war price, pocket the
benefits of war profits and go on par-
ticipating in war profits for the other
farm products on which he is so richly
profiting through war?

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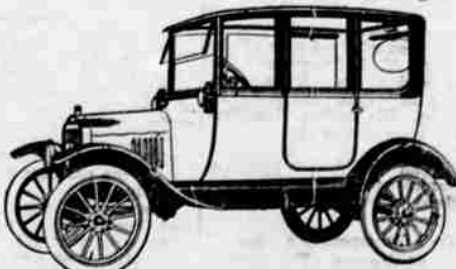

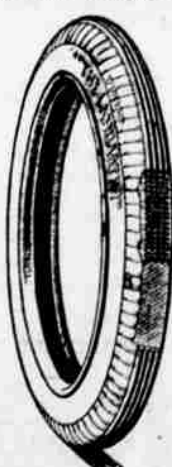
