UNANIMITY

Mr. Garrison, former secretary of war, who knows more history than most of us, says: "It is doubtful if the people of any country, in any war, were ever more wholeheartedly back of their government than the American people are back of their government in this war."

Many a speaker and writer has said substantially the same thing. And the public acquiesces, in a sort of way, but remains only half convinced. It is a thing worth insisting on that, in all probability Mr. Garrison's statement is no mere flight of patriotic fancy, but the literal truth.

There is certainly as much unanimity in this country today as there was in Germany when she started the war, or in France when she rushed to the defense. There is far more unanimity than there was in Great Britain and Italy and Russia. Today it is likely that we are more nearly united in purpose and policy than any other belligerent on either side.

And when we look at our own past with clear eyes, the contrast is greater. In our revolution, our Mexican War, our Civil War, there was an appalling amount of division and obstruction. Washington, during eight weary years, had to fight domestic hostility and indifference more than he fought the British. The Mexican War was regarded by a large part of our people as an unjustifiable war of aggression. Anybody who has read an accurate history of the Civil War knows its unpopularity in the North and Lincoln's struggles to hold the country in line. Our war with Spain was more fully supported than any previous war had been, but it was a small matter, little more than a romantic national adventure. Today we are in grim earnest, in a contest of tremendous scope and depth, and the nation is virtually a unit in conviction and zeal.

We have, of course, various minorities that are apathetic or over-critical or secretly hostile. But they are an extremely small part of the whole. And there is literally no open opposition to the war, in congress or in the press or in the pulpit or on the lecture platform or in the public or private activity of any considerable group of citizens. The only visible differences of opinion are concerning the best way to win. We may say with assurance that never in the world's history have so many people at once been agreed on anything as there are today in this country agreed on the righteousness of our war against Germany. The only real discordant note is heard in congress.

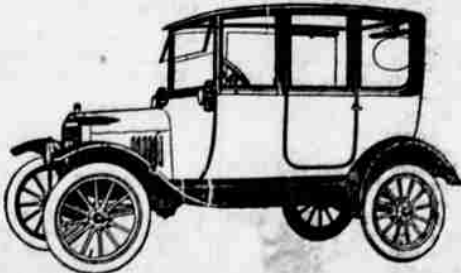

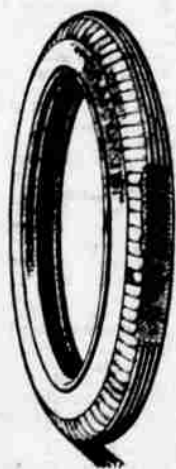
