#### Contempt Proceedings

Started in Circuit Court

Bessie Crawford Morrill, divorced wife of Roy Crawford, has filed a petition and affidavit in the circuit court asking that Crawford be made to appear in court and answer why he should not be cited for contempt of court.

On Jan. 15, 1916, Judge Wm. Galloway granted a decree of divorce to Roy Crawford from his wife, Bessie Crawford. The court decree ordered that their child be placed in the care of Miss Samuel Conn and that plaintiff be compelled to pay \$15 a month

The relator states that the order was not obeyed for four months, when payments became smaller and at intermittent periods. Defendant states that the refusal was for the purpose of harassing her and as a result plaintiff be punished for being in contempt and for disobedience of orders.

Since her divorce from Crawford the relator has been married to a man named Morrill. C. H. Gloss, of Corvallis, is her attorney.
