ANOTHER WAR LIBRARY DRIVE

It is probably true that the woman
who drove up to the public library in
her big limousine and sent in as her
contribution to the soldiers' library
material a load of very ancient mag-
azines that had long occupied a dark
corner in her attic, meant well enough.
But she certainly hadn't given the
matter any serious thought.

War library workers, Y. M. C. A.
workers, officers and men themselves
tell us that the men want current
magazines, live books on up-to-date
subjects and good literature of the
same sort that appeals to the intelli-
gent civilian reader.

The library association is finding
it necessary to send hundreds of thou-
sands of textbooks on art, mechanics,
agriculture; in fact, all lines of serious
study. There is an astonishing and
growing demand among the soldiers
for textbooks of all sorts. The non-
fiction circulation in camp libraries
is larger than in many town libraries.
The public is asked to contribute vol-
umes of biography, history, books of
adventure, poetry, travel, good fiction
—all the things that the public itself
likes to read.

The middle of the month saw the
opening in the public libraries of an-
other big drive for the development
of soldiers' libraries. The men in the
trenches in Europe as well as those
on shipboard and in training camps
need the books. Supplying them is
one of the opportunities given the
people at home to share their work.

Milwaukee is suffering from a but-
ton famine. Nails and safetypins are
said to be doing duty as suspender
buttons. That reminds us somehow
that when the Germans entered Bel-
gium, every one of 'em had two sets
of buttons sewed on his trousers. Mil-
waukee should learn something about
real Teutonic preparedness.

OUR "SEVERE LESSON"

The Berlin papers have been ex-
pressing satisfaction over the partici-
pation of American troops in the big
battle. It is "especially gratifying"
to the German editors, because those
Americans have got a "severe lesson"
in the realities of modern warfare.

Their idea, apparently, is that our
fighting men will be so appalled at
the horrors of the battle, and their
relatives and friends at home so dis-
tressed by their sufferings and losses,
that America will be deterred from
further war preparations.

The same old Prussian failure to
understand non-German psychology!
Those editors utterly fail to realize
how gladly our boys have plunged in-
to the battle-storm at its worst, to
fight for the ideals they hold sacred,
and how glad Americans at home
have been, even in their sorrow, at the
thought that at last our country is
enabled to begin the playing of a man-
ly part in the war.

Both the army and the nation re-
gard this participation as a high priv-
ilege. And a little hard fighting only
whets our appetite for the great cru-
sade. But we do not expect the Prus-
sian press to understand that.

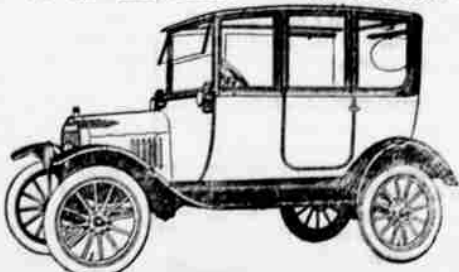
