**SCIO WILL GO OVER THE TOP IN ONE DAY**

**Liberty Loan Committee Is Well Organized; to Complete Work With Rush**

SCIO, April 5.—(Democrat Special Correspondence)—Scio is ready for the opening of the big Liberty Loan drive, which will open here tomorrow. There will be a big rally in the afternoon. W. I. Harrison of Portland will be the principal speaker and his talk will be accompanied with moving pictures on the war. Following this a moving picture show benefit will be given to raise money for carrying on the drive. Already over 900 tickets have been sold, and over 600 people are expected to attend the performance.

E. C. Peery, chairman for the Scio district, and his committee have everything in readiness and expect to exceed the quota the first day. Monday morning at 8 o'clock 11 autos containing two solicitors each will start out at the crack of a pistol and go after the quota of \$15,400. Mr. Peery says that Scio will at least double its quota, for every person he knows of is ready to subscribe for from two to five times his questionnaire allotment. In the Scio district are Crabtree, Thomas, Kingston, Shelburn, Larwood and Jordan, each with its committee and captain.
