PROVIDING THE SUBSTITUTE

It is reassuring to learn that there
is now enough cornmeal available to
satisfy the public demand, even if the
demand is increased by the adoption
of a national corn ration. The food
administration announces that the
corn-milling capacity of the country
has been increased 200 per cent over
last year. Merely from October to
March the output has been doubled,
and the productive capacity is steady-
ly growing. There are also increased
quantities of other wheat substitutes
available, such as oats, barley and rye,
not to mention our fortunate surplus
of potatoes.

Heretofore the public has been
handicapped in its food conservation
by the difficulty of getting the desired
substitutes, and by the prices charged
for them. It was absurd on the face
of it that corn particularly should be
so scarce and high in the market when
it was notoriously so plentiful on the
farms. Better transportation has helped
the mills in easing the situation.

The government should not stop
with insuring plenty of corn products,
but should keep an eye on prices. The
people are willing to substitute corn
almost entirely for wheat, but they
should not be expected to pay for the
corn more than they would pay for
wheat flour, nor as much. To take
advantage of the demand caused by
this patriotic substitution is the worst
sort of profiteering. If there is any-
thing approximating a "corner in
corn," it should be promptly abolished.

ulating himself upon the fact that
there is no law which prevents him
from making an ass of himself, his
newspaper or his party.

It is a far cry from the republican
nomination for United States Senator
to a berth on the State Highway Com-
mission, but the still small voice of

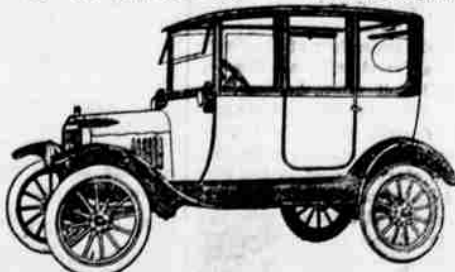

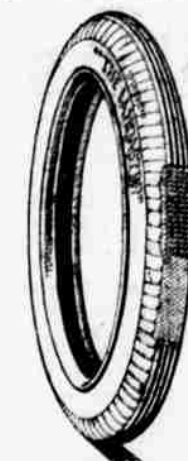
