er, John Murphy at Seio, Monday.

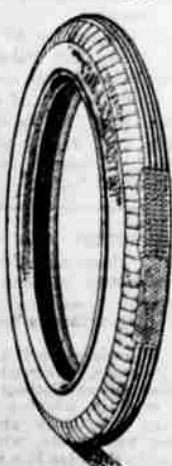

States, associations of such citi-
zens and corporations organized un-
der the laws of the United States or
any state, territory or district thereof

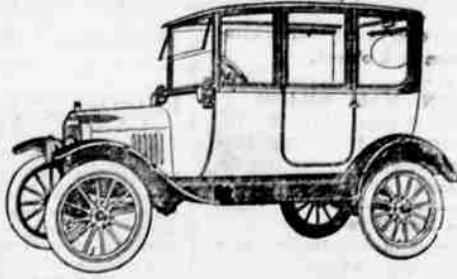
