LaGrande, April 16.
This is being written 2500 feet higher up than Albany. The weather speaks for the difference. This morning the ground was covered with snow, all gone this evening. It feels like more tonight. It is the only cold thing here. The people are warm-hearted, full of modern pep and right up to the scratch in everything that will help whip the inhuman Hun to the right kind of a finish.

I had the pleasure of being present this noon at the weekly business men's lunch, a snappy affair that would have done credit to a city ten times as large. These noonday business lunches have become popular and significant affairs these days of war when Uncle Sam is calling for the unstinted support of every loyal citizen to the last ditch.

Among the speakers was Hon. Walter M. Pierce, democratic candidate for nomination for governor, whom I find is held in very high esteem here, not only because of his splendid personal qualities, but also because of his unquestioned executive ability. Mr. Pierce will make a campaign that will place him in the front rank of vote getters.

The first former Albany person met here was Claude Mackey, son-in-law of M. Bussard. He recently resigned as chief engineer to accept a position in the postoffice.

LaGrande has a city manager, Mr. Curry, and the indications are that he is making good.

The second former Albany person to be met was Mrs. Roscoe Neill, a resident here for six or seven years, and a good booster for the city as well as popular citizen.

Walter Parker also resides here. Not the genial Albany grocer, but another of the same name who used to run a train thru Albany; a salesman.

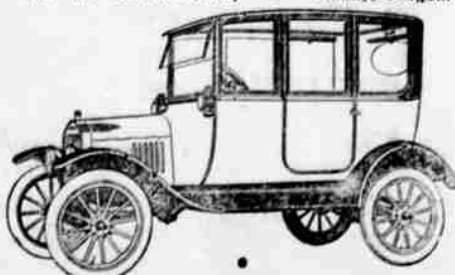

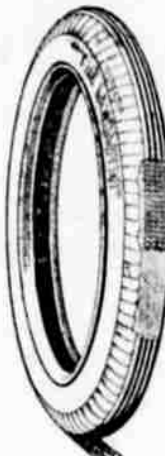
