 sale, money to be returned if sale is

 be received from citizens of the United
 States, associations of such citi-
 zens and corporations organized un-
 der the laws of the United States or
 any state, territory or district thereof

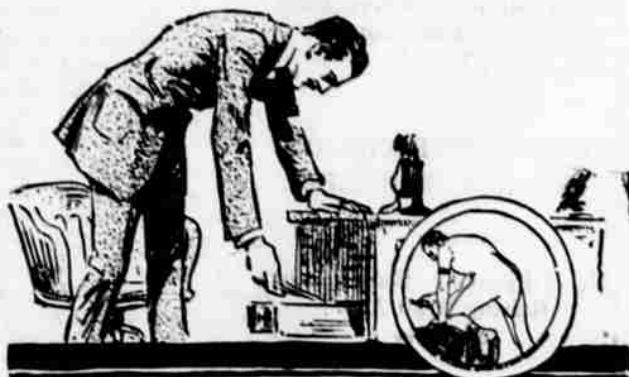

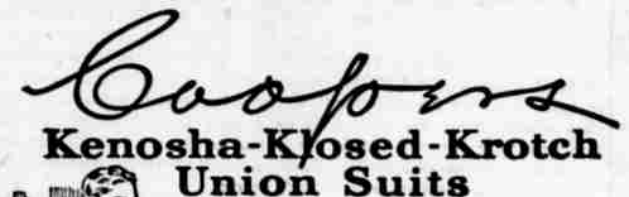

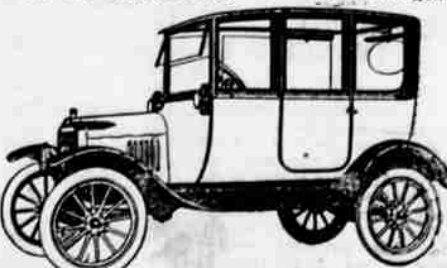
