der the laws of the United States or
any state, territory or district thereof

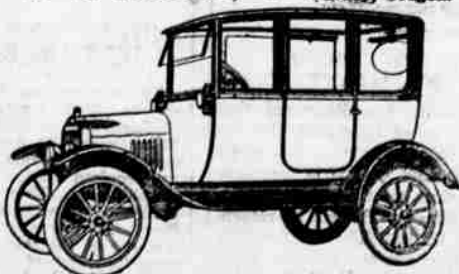
