EXPLANATIONS

The explanations of the German press regarding our part in the war continue to distribute to the amusement of nations.

The German editors first assured their readers that we wouldn't enter the war because we didn't have the nerve; and besides, our German-Americans wouldn't let us.

Now they have been trying to explain away the fact that "notwithstanding our brilliant submarine successes" as the Berlin Lokal-Anzeiger puts it, Germany has not been sinking our transports, and our troops are reaching France in a steady and continually swelling stream.

"If America could send 1,000,000 soldiers, they could not be fed. Our war aim would be reached as well then as if they were drowned."

It's perfectly simple. Germany is luring our troops across the border in order to let them starve to death, thereby saving the expenditure of torpedoes.

And if the German people are ready—with their usual gullibility—to swallow that kindergarten logic, let them do it.

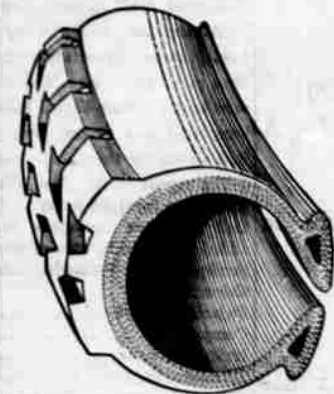
