5 t baking powder.
1 t salt.
2 t sugar (or syrup)
1 cup milk.
1 egg.
2 t shortening.

Sift dry ingredients into a bowl; add milk beaten egg and melted shortening. Stir well. Put into greased pan. Allow to stand in warm place 20 to 25 minutes. Bake in moderate oven 40 to 45 minutes.
