A HEALTHY ARMY

Heretofore the Japanese army has
held the world record for health. Now
Surgeon-General Gorgas reports that
the United States army has beaten the
Japanese record in holding down the
percentage of disease amongst its
troops.

"The health and sanitary conditions
in the American camps," he says, "and
among the men called to active ser-
vice, is satisfactory." From a man of
Gen. Gorgas' high standards, that
modest-sounding statement is really
superlative. "Personal disease among
the men in the army is about the
same as in civil life. We are doing
better than the armies of Europe." And
he claims no special credit for that.
"We ought to do better, because
we have their record and experience to
guide us."

This statement should set at rest
the minds of any civilians who are
worrying about the health conditions
to which their relatives and friends in
the army are exposed. The boys are
at least as well off there as they
would be at home. And nobody has to
rely altogether on the official reports.
Just look at the soldiers as they come
back home on furloughs. Did they
ever look so well in their lives?
