2 c rice flour
5 t baking powder.
3-4 t salt
1-4 c sugar
1-2 c chopped nuts.
1 egg well beaten
1 c milk (more or less)
Sift dry ingredients. Add egg, milk and nuts. Put in greased pan. Allow to stand 10 minutes. Bake in moderate oven 1 hour. Makes one small loaf.

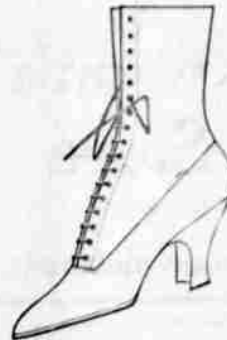

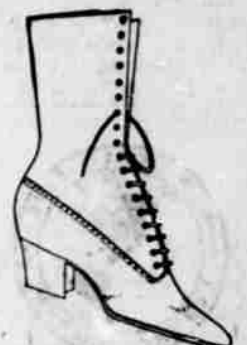
