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DRAFTED FOR WAR WORK

The man of draft age who for any reason happens to be exempted from military service is not therefore exempted from responsibility. If he cannot fight for victory he must work for victory.

That is the meaning of Provost Marshal General Crowder's order requiring men of draft age to give up nonessential occupations and engage in war work. The order is expected to apply to about three-quarters of a million men, and to have a revolutionary effect in the redistribution of labor.

It is impossible to lay down a hard and fast rule as to precisely what constitutes "war work." But certain broad facts about the matter are known to everybody. Shipbuilding, for example, is war work. Employment in a munition factory or airplane factory or any factory engaged in making essential army supplies is war work. Farming is war work. The order will have an immediate and wholesome effect in providing recruits for these industries. Where there is room for doubt the question will be decided by local draft boards. As little injustice as possible will be done.

The most obvious effect will be the withdrawal of men from occupations involving personal service. There will be no more male servants of military age, no more butlers or valets or footmen, no more waiters or ushers, no more "flunkies" of any kind, no more bartenders, no more salesmen or clerks doing work that older or younger men, or women or girls, are capable of doing. And of course the ranks of professional gamblers and other social parasites will be depleted. We're really getting down to a war basis.
