A RAILROAD DICTATORSHIP

Under private management the railroads were run primarily for profit. Under government management they are run primarily for service.

Recent revolutionary acts of the railroad administration have come from this changed view. The roads need new equipment and construction, and to provide it the government lets them have nearly a billion dollars—three times as much as they have lately been spending for such purposes. The money isn't given, however, but lent. The government hands over the cash because it can borrow money and the roads can't.

The discharge of all the railroad presidents was a more drastic and spectacular move. Most of the president-managers had been trying to cooperate loyally with the federal government. But a few of them had ignored federal orders, or obeyed reluctantly. Others had been unable to grasp the new order of things, to get the new viewpoint. And it was desirable, anyhow, that all the lines should be operated by practical railroad managers rather than men trained primarily as financiers. So Director McAdoo made a clean sweep. Many of the former presidents will be reappointed to their lines. All the lines, however, will now be run presumably by men who know their business and are in harmony with the new system.

CREATIVE THRIFT
