A TEST OF DECENCY

An interesting experiment is being made by the American government. It will be an acid test of whether there is any decency and humanity left in the German government. That is not the announced purpose, but that is what the matter amounts to.

Heretofore our sick and wounded sailors have been carried on ordinary transports, conveyed by warships. Now the navy department is fitting out a liner, renamed Comfort, to serve as a hospital ship between this country and our naval base abroad. She will be given all the distinguishing marks prescribed by the Geneva Convention for vessels of her character, and then sent through the war zone without convoy. Germany will be notified of her character and purpose, and will be expected to respect her, according to the rules of international law.

That seems like a good deal to expect of Germany, in view of her war record. She has repeatedly attacked British hospital ships, in France, when their character was unmistakable. Will she honor the Comfort—and herself—now?

It may be that the sheer audacity of the thing will recall the German decency and enable our navy to "get away with it." We shall see. Though dubious, we are willing to be shown. If it works it will be a notable step toward saving the war from progressive barbarism.

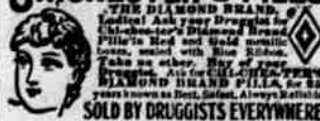
