

**Animal Tuberculosis****Work Is Extended**

Sixty-four federal employees and 64 state employees are engaged this year in fighting animal tuberculosis, that widely distributed disease which causes an annual loss estimated at \$25,000,000.

The Bureau of Animal Industry has recently extended operations for the control of this disease in 31 states. Headquarters have been established in 12 important centers from which the work will be supervised and directed.

**Machinegun Will Be****Shown at Camp Lewis**

CAMP LEWIS, June 15.—(Special)—That probably most effective of all modern implements of warfare and the weapon concerning the operation of which the public is least familiar, the machinegun, will be demonstrated in the big military horse show here Sunday, June 16. These guns and their carts, animal drawn, will be seen and heard in a drill to demonstrate the efficiency of the division's machinegun units.

A number of machineguns will enter the arena and go through maneuvers just as on the battlefield, reaching the desired position and starting rapid firing. At one end of the arena there is an abrupt hill and it is into this that the swift succession of bullets from these guns will be directed. Those who witnessed the demonstrations at the previous show regarded this drill as the most thrilling of all.

With these maneuvers will be shown those of the 346th Field Artillery, in a splendid display of action. This unit has 1250 solid bay horses and no other like organization in the American Army is better provided in this regard. Selected representation from this unit will offer a demonstration both of the efficiency of the horses that draw the guns and of the men who operate them.

These guns and teams will swing into action, unlimber and fire a salvo of shot.

**LIBERTY BREADS****Potato-Cornmeal Muffins**

1 cup mashed potato  
1 cup cornmeal  
1-2 cup sifted flour  
1 teaspoon salt  
3 teaspoons baking powder  
1 or 2 tablespoons syrup  
2 tablespoons shortening  
1 or 2 eggs  
Liquid to mix to a medium batter (about 1-2 cup).

Add the cornmeal, salt, syrup and 1-2 cup liquid to the hot mashed potato, place in double boiler and steam 10 to 30 minutes. Add the shortening and allow to cool thoroughly. When cold add the well-beaten eggs and the flour which has been sifted with the baking powder. Add just enough more liquid, if necessary, to make a somewhat stiff batter. Beat thoroughly, place in greased pan until half-filled and bake 25 to 30 minutes in a moderately hot oven.

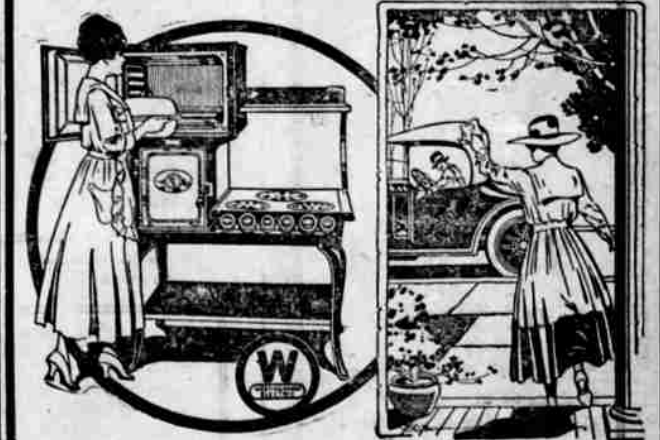
#### From Passamaquoddy
