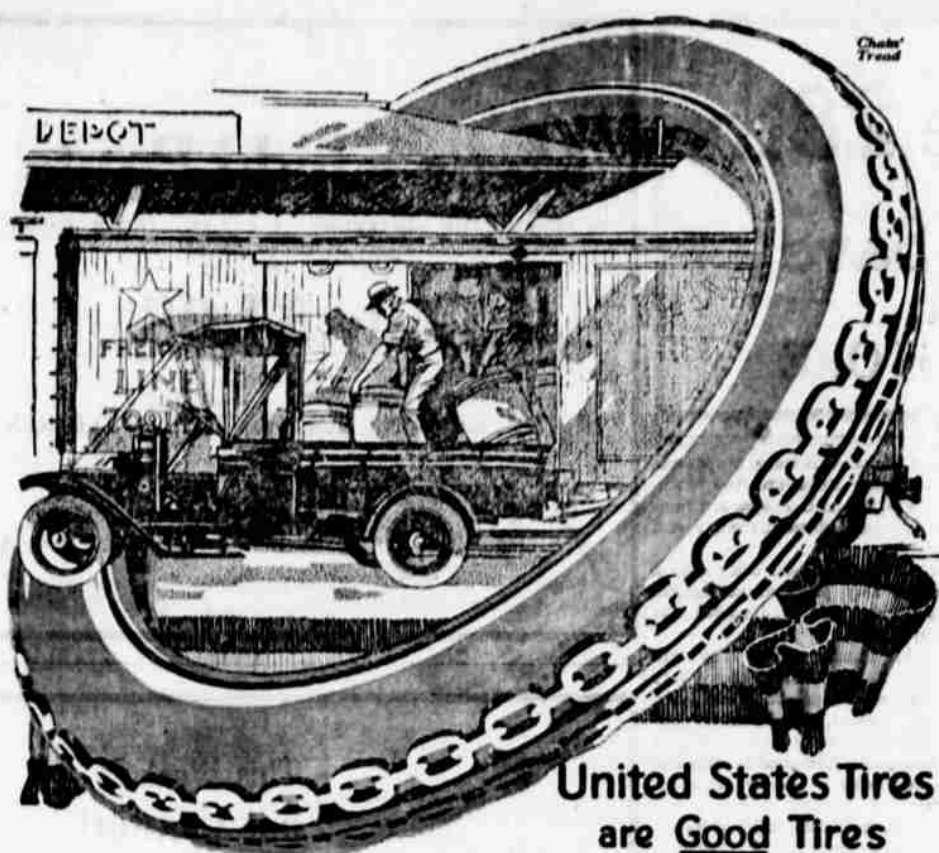

CANADA THISTLE CONTROL BY CLEAN CULTIVATION

O. A. C. EXPERIMENT STATION, June 19.—(Special)—Canada thistles may be slowly starved to death by preventing any part from growing above ground during the season, says B. F. Sheehan of the O. A. C. experiment station.

"The college recommends clean culture as the best means of eradication," he reports. "It is necessary to keep the infested area cultivated throughout the season, that no shoots may appear above ground. It takes a portion of the food stored in the roots to start new sprouts above ground, and if this part is cut off whenever it appears the food supply will become exhausted. If allowed to grow above ground new food is stored and life continues. Only a few days' growth will store up enough added food to last the plant a good while."

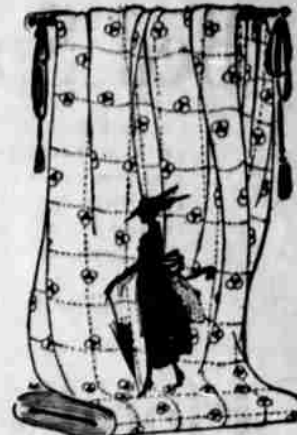
