TRUTH AND LIES

The world is much edified by the recent statement of Dr Von Kuehlman—German foreign minister—before the Reichstag:

"I do not believe that any reasonable man in Germany not even the Kaiser or the members of the Imperial Government, ever for a moment believed they could win the domination of Europe by starting this war.

"The idea of world-dominion in Europe is a Utopia, as proved by Napoleon. The nation which tried it would, as happened to France, bleed to death in useless battle and would be most grievously injured and lowered in her development. One may here apply von Moltk's phrase, 'Woe to him who sets Europe afire!'"

"At no moment of our later history was there less occasion for us to start or contribute to the starting of a conflagration than the moment in which it occurred."

Here indeed is a curious blending of truth and lies such as could hardly be concocted anywhere outside of Prussia, for the consumption of any people but Prussians. The idea, of course, is to persuade the credulous that Germany never undertook to conquer Europe and dominate the world. The argument is that Germany could not have done so, because world-dominion is an impossible dream.

Even if there were not convincing evidence of German guilt from a thousand sources, the Berlin statesman would have difficulty in convincing the world that Germany would have been deterred from the crime she stands charged with by its demonstrable folly. We know the power of self-delusion inherent in the German mind, and we know the evil purpose of German rulers as shown by practice and precept.

It is true that there was "no occasion for Germany to launch this horrible war." It is true that neither Germany nor any other power on earth can conquer Europe and rule the world, because the other nations will inevitably rise up and protect themselves. It is true that any nation embarking on so ambitious an adventure will be "most grievously injured and lowered in her development." That is exactly what Germany is discovering today.

The rest is lies. We know how the Kaiser, Ludendorf, Hindenburg, von Kuehlman and all their brutal, predatory ring plotted to slaughter their neighbors, loot Europe and boss the earth from Berlin. Foiled in the attempt, with their punishment impending, they wriggle in vain to extricate themselves. relentless justice will settle the argument. Specious logic-chopping is of no avail. Bullets and the sword of rement.
