HINDENBURG'S GREATEST VICTORY

One of the most notable contributions to the true history of Germany's war is a little book called "The Devastation of Europe," published in Switzerland by Dr. Wilhelm Muehlon, former director of the famous Krupp works at Essen. In that book he tells, from his own knowledge, how the Kaiser forced war upon the world, and gives many amazing glimpses into the secret purposes of the German government and the militarized and brutalized soul of the German people.

There is one passage of particular interest because it shows up, in all its hideousness, the famous achievement which won von Hindenburg his reputation and made him the idol of the German people—his great victory over the Russians in the Mazurian Lake region of East Prussia.

"What did Hindenburg's troops do when they defeated the Russians? The Germans tell each other: It was not sufficient to have the enemy driven into the swamps; tens of thousands who surrendered and tried to climb out of the fen were pushed back again with bayonets until they were suffocated or drowned. Such was the command. No quarter was to be given, for we had no use for so many prisoners. It is said that one could hear the cries of the poor Russians, that the thunder of the cannon was drowned by the cries and that many who had to hear the shrill sounds of desperation, became insane.

"Ninety thousand prisoners were made in that battle; but still more, it is stated, were murdered when they were defenseless and begged mercy.

"I have no reliable information as to whether that is all true; but everybody contends it is true, and nobody utters one word of regret. To the contrary, everybody approves the incident, saying that no other procedure would have been right. And this sentiment is of greater significance than whether the rumor is true or not."

A "glorious victory" indeed! More than 90,000 men, acknowledging their helplessness and trying to surrender according to the rules of war, shot and bayoneted and drowned like rats, with the approval of Hindenburg and the Kaiser. The ugly details were not printed but everyone knew about it and "everybody approved."

There you have the Iron Hindenburg in his best form. And there you have the German government, once revered as humane and enlightened, at whose progressive brutalization Dr. Muehlon himself is appalled, as we are.
