JOURNALISTIC HONESTY

In the troubles of the New York Evening Mail may be read an instructive lesson on the virtual impossibility of "putting anything over" on the American public.

The Evening Mail stands accused of having been bought with German money, part of a \$30,000,000 fund at the disposal of von Bernstorff and Dr. Albert. The transaction antedates our entrance into the war. The purpose, according to the charges brought by the federal department of justice, was to use the Evening Mail to cultivate friendliness for Germany by the indirect means of criticizing the allies.

It was believed by the master minds in Berlin that such a scheme would work. The Prussian publicity experts had no doubt that Americans would believe what they were told, as the Germans do. Their control of the Evening Mail—if such control existed, as charged—was based on that theory.

It is said to have cost about three-quarters of a million dollars to buy the paper in question. No sooner had the management begun its propaganda work than the paper in question began to lose money so fast that before long the Kaiser had to put up another three-quarters of a million for running expenses.

It is the same error that has led to the ruin of so many German-language papers in this country. Even German-Americans will not stand for dishonest success except through honesty.

THE CAMP ACTIVITIES EXHIBIT

The work of the commission on training camp activities is interestingly portrayed in an exhibit at the allied war exhibition recently opened in San Francisco.

The first thing in the exhibit is a model of a typical scene on the Mexican border in 1916. The bad conditions found there by a war department investigation led to the formation of the present commission. The model of the Mexican border scene shows the listless, dispirited soldiers with nothing to do and no place to go save a few dirty saloons.

The contrast with the scenes that follow is striking and cheering. There are models of athletic field boxing, wrestling, baseball, football, basketball, pushball, tennis and so on. A thousand men practicing the movements of a boxing drill at one time and a moving picture showing the relation between skill in boxing and bayonet work are shown.

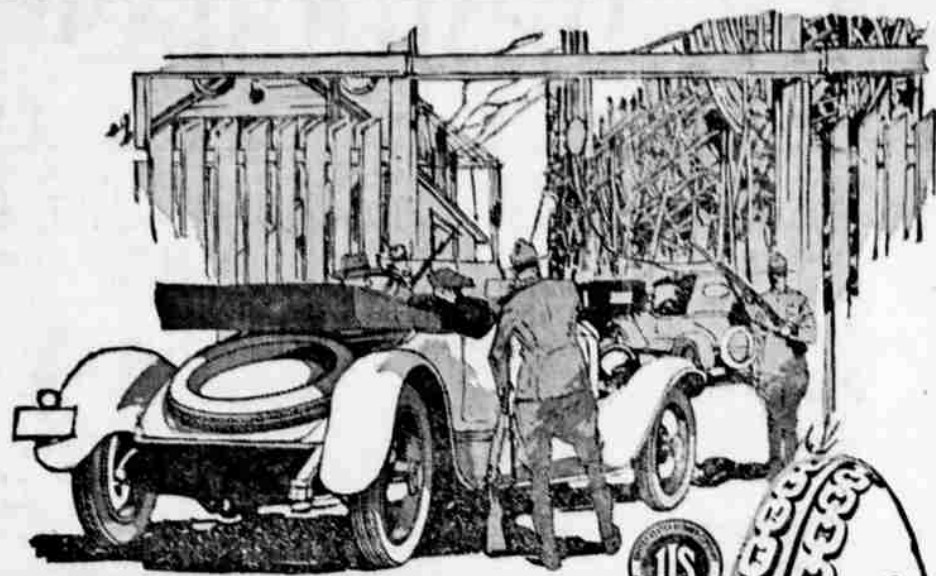
There are the Liberty Theater with its clean shows; the camp library, the typical huts of the Knights of Columbus, the Jewish Welfare Board and the Y. M. C. A. with their facilities for recreation, letter writing and visiting; the Y.W.C.A. hostess house, furnishing comfortable and attractive resting and meeting place for wives or mothers or sisters of soldiers.

There are models showing the work done by community service clubs outside of the camps, clubs that help to bring the soldier on leave into the community, to make him welcome and a part of the wholesome community life. Maps and charts show the five-mile vice and liquor zone and indicate the work carried on by the law enforcement division of the commission.

The achievements of the commission may still fall short of its hope and purpose. But the work already done is marvellous. The interest and support of every civilian should be given unreservedly to backing up the commission in its work to protect our soldiers and sailors, to keep them fit, physically and morally.

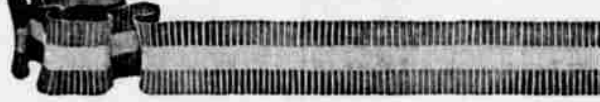
