**A SINCERE PEACE PROPOSAL**

Chancellor von Hertling announces, with a fine flourish of Prussian virtue, that Germany is prepared to receive peace proposals from the allies "if they are offered in a spirit of sincerity." Austria a day or so ago made much the same offer.

Nobody in any allied country will take the trouble to discuss the question of "sincerity" with Germany. It isn't worth while.

For years before the war the allies sincerely tried to persuade the German government to consent to the limitation of armament and the peaceful settlement of international differences. Germany steadfastly refused. During the momentous month of July, 1914, the allies moved heaven and earth in sincere efforts to ward off the impending struggle, offering everything short of their own dishonor to dissuade Germany from her fell purpose. It was of no use. Again and again, throughout the war, proposals have been put forward by allied spokesmen for an honest peace, based on equitable settlement and honest guarantees for the future. Germany has invariably dodged and misrepresented these proposals, and gone ahead with her plans of conquest and loot.

The German government has several times put forward tentative peace proposals, always of a sort that no honorable nation, with its own safety and the world's welfare in mind, could possibly accept; or if fair-seeming, they have been couched in equivocal terms, so that they could be altered or withdrawn at Germany's pleasure. Now the war has gone too far for any further fooling. Germany has committed too many crimes for condonation. The allies have suffered too much. Faith in German honor has been too irretrievably shattered. There can be no more feelers, no more bandying of words.

The allies today have one clear purpose, which they cannot change. They must and will go through to the end. They can state their peace terms at any time, with absolute sincerity, in two words.

Those words are—"UNCONDITIONAL SURRENDER."

And the only proposal we want or expect from Germany can be fully stated in one word. It will be the answer to our ultimatum, and it will be delivered by the Kaiser, with his hands up, whining, "Kamerad!"

**GERMAN CHILDREN'S VACATION**

Hay is scarce in Germany, like nearly every other kind of provender for man or beast. Accordingly, Germany resorts to an "ersatz." Dried leaves are not so good as dried timothy, but they will stave off equine starvation. So the trees are to be stripped.

But who shall do the stripping, drying and storing of this ersatz hay? A happy thought occurred to the government of Saxony—let the children do it! It was so ordered.

The youngsters, however, did not take to the work with alacrity. Wherefore the government had another happy thought. An order was issued to the effect that unless the schoolchildren "voluntarily" gathered 200,000 tons of leaves, they would be deprived of the usual summer vacation beginning July 15.

There is one more little reason why the rising generation in Germany will grow up loving militarism, isn't it?
