YANKEE HORSE GETS FINE LANGUAGE WORK

WITH THE AMERICANS, Picardy,
July 19.—Special.—The American
horse is an apt linguist.

Sold overseas to the French from
America during the first three years
of the war, he had to learn French to
understand his new masters. Then
sold back to Americans for service
with his own army after the United
States entered the war, he had to learn

English, or rather American, all over
again.

Hundreds of these American horses
were bought from the French when
the first forces from the United States
landed. The drivers were constantly
in trouble, and at first couldn't under-
stand the reason.

I had a team out during a review,"
