PRIVATE MIKE O'ROURKE HOLDS DISTINCTIOUS RECORD

Supposing, as the children say, you had climbed out of your comfortable trench and into the crackling, bursting, bullet-blown hades of No Man's Land to achieve the rescue of a sorely wounded comrade. When they pinned a medal on you, after that bit of gallantry, you wouldn't flinch from the honor, would you?

Well, in the case of Private Mike O'Rourke, who wears the Victoria Cross and who speaks at the Globe Thursday, they gave it to him because of more than a dozen such rescues, made when the missiles between the lines were flying almost like hail. And he wears two more medals, when he wants to, both for gallantry—the military medal and the distinguished conduct medal.

It's Private Mike O'Rourke, of the three medals and a heavy reserve of Celtic humor, who will talk to Albany people about the war in Flanders. O'Rourke, of the three medals, which is more than any other living man ever wore for Britain, will tell a few tales of himself and the stunts that made men call him the first hero of the allied armies, but he will speak at length of his comrades and the camps and trenches. When O'Rourke talks of the war he draws it near to you—for he has the Irish gift of story telling and the memory of all he has seen is vivid to him.

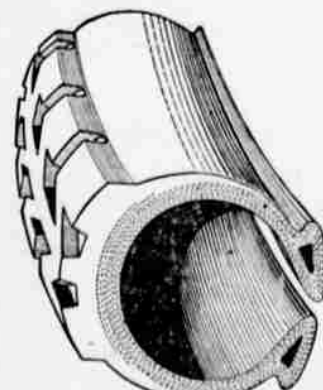
