TO HONOR MEN IN NEW STUDENT CORPS

Recruits to Be Recognized by O. A. C. Alumni Association

O. A. C., Corvallis, Aug. 1.—Special.—Recruits who enlist in the students' army training corps, to be established in the Oregon Agricultural college next fall, will be honored by O. A. C. alumni clubs all over the state in the same way that communities have been honoring the men who go to training camps.

All students who go to a college or university where a students' army training corps is established, will be eligible for enlistment in the corps, which is equivalent to joining the military forces of the United States. While enlistment of students over 18 or enrollment of those under 18 is not obligatory, all men will probably join the corps in order to carry out the government's purpose to provide for the needs of the army highly trained

men as officers, engineers, doctors, chemists and administrators of every kind.

As these men are in the United States army, subject to call, uniformed and trained by the war department, and subject to the obligations of a soldier, why not give them the honor that is their due and send them off to college with the approval and blessing of their home town?

The cooperation of the alumni of other institutions having students' army training units will be sought in the effort to honor all recruits of these training units. The whole movement will be articulated with the work of the state council of defense.

BUILD HUT EVERY DAY

Since August 4, 1914, not a day has intervened but a Y. M. C. A. hut has been erected in France for the allied soldiers.

SEAGULLS REVEAL MINE

LONDON, Aug. 1.—"Seagulls Saviour" might be the headline for this store. A pilot off the southeast coast saw a number of the birds clustered on top of the water directly on the ship's course.
