THOSE WASTED MILLIONS

It is gratifying to learn, on the testimony of no less an authority than George Sylvester Viereck, that after apending about \$50,000,000 for propaganda in this country, Germany "got nothing for it." The fact, of course, has long been patent, but one hardly expects a Viereck to admit it, seeing that he himself was one of the propagandists who undertook to turn that money into American sympathy for

It was inevitable that the money should be wasted. It was likewise inevitable that the effort put forth by all the propagandists, imported or na tive, paid or unpaid, should be wasted because it was based on an absurd misunderstanding of America.

Viereck really thought that if he had been given \$40,000,000 or \$50,000. 000 to buy American newspapers with he could have kept America out of the war. He still thinks so, despite the experience of the New York Mail which lost influence in proportion as it became an apologist for Germany. and was forced to resume its Americanism in spite of its German con-

German propaganda really succeeded, to a remarkable degree, before the war. It aroused in this country an unfounded and mischievous distrust of Japan, and a tremendously exaggerated idea of German civilization With the beginning of the war, how-ever, the Prussian doctors of opinion lost their cunning. They have failed utterly all through the conflict, and now that we have once seen through the sham they will fail utterly here

#### CHICKENS COMING HOME

Von Mirbach, Prussian ambassado and dictator in Moscow, was assas-sinated. Nobody outside of Germany was surprised; and to tell the truth, persons outside of the Central Empires were greatly shocked or of-

Recently von Eichorn, Prussian military dictator in Ukrania, has been assassinated. Again, intelligent outsiders are not surprised or perturbed. What else can Germany expect. If

in normal times, Russians who rightly or wrongly regarded themselves as patriots were given to blowing up rulers of their own blood, by way of protest, what is more natural than that they should use the same weapon against alien tyrants more cruel and oppressive than any czar they have had in a hundred years?

For once we are tempted to sympa thize with anarchy. We recognize, at least, that the anarchy represented by the nihilist assassins is less culpable and less menacing than the law lessness of conquering Prussianism.

These victims of Russian indignation may serve as examples of what Germany may expect if she persists in her ruthless policy of slaughter. slayery and exploitation. If Russia cannot fight openly, she can fight effectively in secret. Prussia's favor-ite policy of terrorization at last comes home to her. Henceforth no Prussian life is safe beyond the eastern frontiers

O. A. C., Corvallis, Aug. 6. Special. Do not allow the Canada thistle tato bloom in most sections of the state and should be cut. Immediate action will save thousands of dollars to Oregon and will prevent the infestation of thistle-free fields.
