A WAR OF ACTION

"War," wrote Marshal Foch before the present conflict, "positive in its nature, permits only of positive answers. There is no result without cause; if you seek the result, develop the cause—employ force. If you wish your opponent to withdraw, beat him; otherwise nothing is accomplished, and there is only one means to that end—the battle. There is no victory without battle."

In another place he wrote, "Of all military mistakes, one only is disgraceful—inaction."

There you have the commander-in-chief of the allied armies. He has been well described as "an offensive fighter." He was always that in theory, in the days when the war was to France a purely theoretical matter. He put his theory into practice in the first battle of the Marne. He gave it renewed application in the second Marne battle. He is re-emphasizing it today in Picardy.

Figures, now on, thank Heaven, this is to be a war of action, with the allies determining the action. The long, disheartening period of defensive effort and ferreted hope is at an end. We have the men, and we have the man. Foch, biding his time, at last is able to carry the war to the enemy, and we may depend on it that henceforth that enemy will have no rest until he lays down his arms in exhaustion and defeat.

THE OMEN OF CAVALRY

The one best word in the war news nowadays is cavalry. Its almost daily appearance in news dispatches from the front is the real proof that the tide has turned. It is evidence enough that the German trench line, for four years the boundary of beleaguered territory, is not impregnable.

The mention of cavalry in a dispatch from the front means that there is fighting in the open, that the day of the sniper, the sapper and the mine-thrower is done for a time. It means that there are battles on, rather than slowly-progressing sieges, and that the Germans are at last on their way to the Rhine.

Foch, almost alone among the great commanders of the war, is not a cavalryman, but the allied generalissimo is showing an appreciation of cavalry's capabilities as keen even as that of Sir John French or the Grand Duke Nicholas, or Hindenburg. To him the cavalymen are the light reserves, the mobile forces which may be shifted up and down the line as the German pressure varies or the allied advance develops, flung into a gap ahead of foot-slogging infantry to hold a strategic point until the guns come up, or shoved through a break in the German line to outflank artillery, cut communications, or harass retreating infantry.

Foch's conception of the function of cavalry is not Napoleonic. He does not hold his horsemen for that knock-out blow which concluded almost every pitched battle of a century ago. Foch works, rather, as did Sheridan and Kilpatrick, Jeb Stuart and Forrest. His cavalry is simple mounted infantry which rides to battle and fights on foot.

Of course, the French and British mounted men in his armies carry sabres and lances for use in the occasional charge, but they carry rifles and shovels, too. Their part, indeed, is "to get there first with the most men," as the Confederate General Forrest, himself a great cavalryman, said when he undertook the definition of strategy.

Foch is a master strategist. His use of cavalry is one of the evidences.
