TOYS AND BOYS.

The United States Shipping Board has recognized Christmas and birthdays, and is to use the holidays of youth for propaganda purposes.

Chairman Hurley has just issued an appeal to toy makers to forward the work of those who seek to hasten the development of America's merchant marine, and the toy men have agreed.

The war, of course, has influenced children's toys as it has influenced every life and colored every thought. There are tin soldiers and toy cannon, miniature war ships and tanks and fortresses on every market, but this has not satisfied the shrewd propagandists who hope to see the nation's flag on every sea.

His plan should work. It is, indeed, essential to the youngsters, like their elder brothers in the service and their fathers who foot the nation's bills should be interested in the war and war's devices.

WOMEN OFFICE SEEKERS.

"If women are given the ballot, first thing we know they'll be seeking public office!"

This was the wail of the man-voter who opposed equal suffrage. Because there were others who believed that women, sharing the privileges of democracy, should also share its obligations, who believed that a woman with brains, education and honesty could administer an office as well as a man with the same qualifications, the suffrage has come to many women in different parts of the country.

And the terrified man-voter whose wail is given above, is now probably seeking a safely remote retreat, his worst fears justified.

The September primaries in New York City show the names of 11 women candidates for nomination for various offices.

Among the nominations sought are one in the assembly, two to the Democratic state committee, one for county clerk, two for state senate, and one for congress.

An interesting contest is predicted in several cases. But in the event that all the women are nominated and some elected, now even the most pessimistic and grouchy anti-suffragist any longer predicts the collapse of good government or the end of the world.
