AUSTRIA TRIES TO CHARM THE SERBS

ROME, Oct. 7.—Martyred Serbia is being made the victim of one of the most diabolical and insidious forms of propaganda the Austrians have yet devised.

At Salonika, Corfu, Rome, Paris and in fact at almost every center in any of the allied countries there are scores of Serbian soldiers, whose families, mothers, sisters and children are either interned in Austria or living in Serbia under Austrian domination and surveillance.

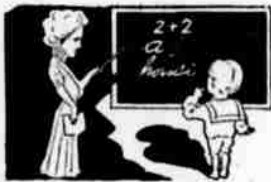
These officers, who now have not seen their families for over two years, instead of receiving from the latter news that might only stimulate them to greater hatred and greater effort against Austria, receive instead just the contrary.

The wives, mothers, sisters, sweethearts and daughters of these Serbian officers are encouraged and even helped to dress nicely, to live in such a manner that they will not only reflect an unusual degree of physical well-being but finally to have their photographs taken which the Austrian authorities kindly allow to be sent by way of Switzerland so the Serb officers may see how well their families fare under Austrian control, how fat and plump their children are, how well dressed their wives are, how well what a mistake it is for these Serbian officers not to give up the struggle and accept Austrian domination which would mean so much for the welfare of the officers themselves as of their families.

Women Write Letters

Naturally the women of Serbia, unsuspecting the ulterior design back of these Austrian amenities, and wishing above all that their male relatives in the Serbian army be free from worry, often write letters accompanying the photographs telling of their prosperity well being and comparative happiness that might be effective with anyone less schooled in the intricacies of Austrian propaganda and policy than the Serbs.

adopted by Austria before the war to win over to Austrian domination the Yugoslav provinces of Slavonia, Dalmatia and Croatia. In these provinces by construction of schools and colleges and by conferring physical benefits far beyond what Austria was doing for other already subjugated provinces, the Dual Monarchy hoped to curry favor of the Yugoslav population to a point where it would accept willingly Austrian domination and forget its ideals for national and racial liberty.

The failure of this propaganda is apparent in the present demand of the Yugoslav residents of these provinces for the creation of an independent Yugoslav state.

Would Win Serbs Over

That Austria has not given up her former dreams of complete domination in the Balkans as an outlet to the Mediterranean at Salonika, is indicated also by other forms of propaganda which aim to win Serbia over. Through the portion of Serbia occupied by the Austrians the military authorities have limited the requisition for food, livestock and produce to the minimum quantity, leaving the great bulk with the Serbian peasants.

Simultaneously, agents thru Serbia have begun a propaganda in favor of the Serbs by means of which Austria hopes to get an apparent consent of the Serb population for Austrian domination.

The suggestion is even made that in the reorganization of Austria into a confederation of states, Serbia would be allowed the same important role as all of the other members of the confederation.

While all this propaganda unquestionably meets with some success, yet there is every indication that the population has been schooled too long in Austrian duplicity to be caught.
