C., August 29, 1918.—Notice is hereby given that subject to the conditions and limitations of the Act of June 9, 1916 (39 Stat., 218) and the instructions of the Secretary of the Interior of September 15, 1917, the timber on the following lands will be sold October 23, 1918, at 10 o'clock a. m., at public auction at the United States land office at Portland, Oregon, to the highest bidder at not less than the appraised value as shown by this notice, sale to be subject to the approval of the Secretary of the Interior. The purchase price, with an additional sum of one-fifth of one per cent thereof, being commissions allowed, must be deposited at time of sale, money to be returned if sale is not approved, otherwise patent will issue for the timber which must be removed within ten years. Bids will be received from citizens of the United States, associations of such citizens and corporations organized under the laws of the United States or any State, territory or district thereof only. Upon application of a qualified purchaser, the timber on any legal subdivision will be offered separately before being included in any offer of a larger unit. Women are needed for service in France as motor drivers. The active service will be in the hospital areas behind the firing line.

But four women in Linn county so far have applied for instruction. Linn county has many women drivers. Your country needs your service—apply at Red Cross headquarters for information.

A Christmas parcel label is now being issued to every man abroad, who will mail his label to some relative or friend. Upon receipt of this label you should take it to the nearest Red Cross chapter and receive one carton 3x4x8 inches in size. When the carton is filled it should be taken to the place where it was procured.

article barred by postoffice department, remove any notes or messages, wrap, tie and weigh the parcel, and place on the parcel the Christmas parcel label received from abroad, bearing the name and address of the recipient. The person sending the parcel shall then in the presence of the R. C. representative, affix stamps at the rate of 12 cents for each pound or fraction thereof. The R. C. representative will then affix to the parcel the R. C. inspection label, properly signed. The parcel ready for mailing shall remain in the custody of the Red Cross until delivered by its representative to the postoffice authorities.

Expenditures of the American Red Cross in England from October, 1917, to the end of June including contributions to the British Red Cross and British ambulance committee, totaled \$4,312,568, according to the latest of the series of reports which the war council is making to the American people relative to use being made of the Red Cross war fund. Prior to October, when the commission for England was created, the work of caring for American troops in that country was performed by the London chapter at a cost of \$493,453, this amount including \$39,612 expended for the relief of the Tuscany survivors. For the last half of this year an appropriation of \$4,483,800 has been made.

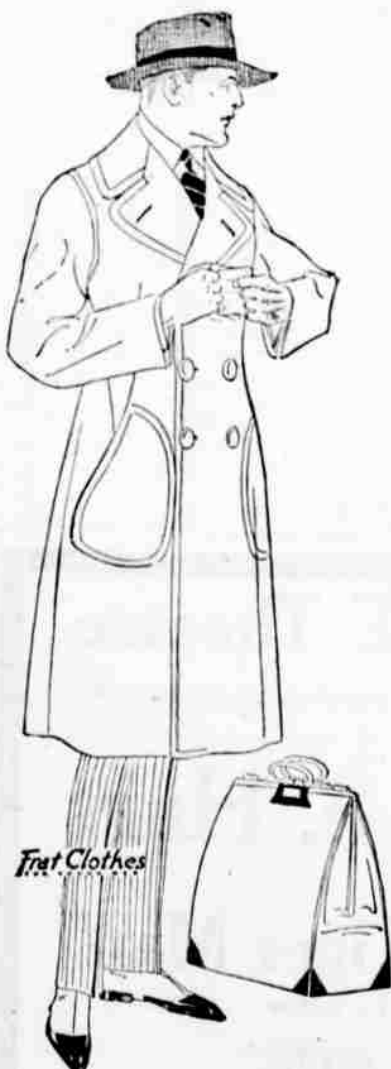

Oregon Normal School War Emergency Course and Certificate

Owing to the scarcity of teachers the Oregon Normal School will offer a War Emergency Course of twenty weeks outlined by the Superintendent of Public Instruction. The Course will begin with each of the terms commencing Nov. 16, 1918; Feb. 8, 1919; and April 12, 1919. The Superintendent of Public Instruction will consider it equivalent to the Teachers' Training Course and issue a certificate upon its completion valid to teach in the elementary grades for one year. This course will be open to those who have had two years or more of high school work or its equivalent. No age limit is required for entrance, but before a certificate can be issued applicant must be at least eighteen years of age. All regular courses will be offered as usual.
