LINN COUNTY POMONA GRANGE HOLDS MEET

Many Speakers Included on Program; Attendance Is Good

The Linn County Pomona Grange met last Saturday with Morning Star Grange, A. C. Miller, master, in the chair. The attendance was good considering the very busy season among farmers, and reports from Granges were quite encouraging.

By action of Pomona the master appointed E. E. Allen, C. L. Shaw and Acting Secretary Mrs. Lula Miller, to secure blanks for reports from subordinate granges.

The special committee appointed at the last previous meeting of the Pomona Grange to confer with the equalization board as to lowering the taxes of property in Albany, as was rumored on account of an many vacant houses, and raising that of farmers' taxes, reported thru C. L. Shaw, chairman, that the county court had been interviewed and the positive statement made that the board had no intention of so equalizing the taxes. It had no right to do so. It was beyond its jurisdiction. The above report was accepted and the committee continued for next year to look after the interests of the farmers.

E. E. Allen, C. L. Shaw and F. M. Mitchell were appointed a committee to make report as to the normal school question, in view of there being upon the ballot for next November the proposition to establish a normal school in Southern Oregon and one in Eastern Oregon, law to become effective after the war.

The committee unanimously reported that it was not best at this time to provide for additional normal schools and its report was as decidedly adopted.

It was voted that the executive committee of the Pomona be authorized to sell the public market property in Albany and on the best terms possible.

It was voted that the next meeting of Pomona be on Wednesday, Dec. 18, and held with Fairmount Grange, of North Albany.

It was voted that M. S. Allen be a committee of one to confer with a like committee of the Farmers' Union to arrange with the Linn County Agricultural agent for the pooling and selling of next year's wool and mohair crop.

Pomona favored the erection at Washington, D. C., of an agricultural temple for the benefit of the national farming interests, funds to be raised by popular subscription.

State Master C. E. Spence will be asked to present this matter to the national grange at the coming November annual session.

terms with Germany by the allies, reported by a resolution that no peace terms be granted except unconditional surrender. The secretary was instructed to forward copy of the resolution to President Wilson.

The main feature in the lecturer's program was an excellent and very profitable talk by Prof. Dunn of O. A. C. upon "Cost of Production." He emphasized the necessity of farmers keeping farm accounts, not only as to all expenses and receipts, but upon certain special crops as oats, wheat, corn, etc. Taking 20 acres of oats as an example he put down each item of expense; manpower and teamwork at current rates; putting in the crop, and harvesting the same; cost of seed, wear and tear of machinery; interest on land worth say \$100 per acre at six per cent; hauling grain say six miles or more to market. On a yield of 30 bushels per acre or a total of 600 bushels selling at \$1 per bushel, the farmer comes out somewhat ahead.

One of the most enjoyable features of this session was the splendid dinner served by the ladies; a feast made up by combining the luncheon brought in by visiting members.

One Case of Influenza Reported Here Today

Dr. W. H. Davis reports that Frank Barrett is suffering from a mild attack of Spanish influenza. This is the only case thus far reported to city or county health authorities from the city of Albany.

The epidemic in Corvallis is now under control, the number of cases dropping from 229 on October 11 to 182. There have been no deaths in Corvallis as a result of the epidemic.

HUMAN FLY TO SCALE ALBANY HOTEL

Event Will Take Place Tonight Rain or Shine; 25 Per Cent to Red X

Sometime ago Albany was visited by a man who claimed to be the human fly and attempted to scale one of the local buildings. Mr. Williams is not the same man but is the original human fly who on May 11, 1911, climbed the Woolworth Building in New York City. Mr. Williams comes to Albany well-recommended and will give a creditable exhibition.

He will take up a collection from those witnessing his exhibition and 25 percent will be turned over to the local Red Cross.
