WITHYCOMBE'S CANDIDACY

The people of Oregon have had four years of Withycombe. They have had ample opportunity to take the measure of the man, segregate his political mistakes from his virtues and to form an intelligent opinion of his qualifications for the high office to which he aspires.

We are guilty of disclosing no secret when we state that the governor has drawn his votes from the rural districts and his political revelations from Multnomah county. When the governor needed advice and counsel he went to the men who have acquired all of the right, title and interest in the political machine which in days gone by attained its greatest power under the leadership of Joe Simon and Jack Matthews. He sought the advice of practical politicians and acted upon it with a childlike faith in their judgment.

As an illustration, take the recent appointment of Conrad Olson of Portland to a place on the supreme bench. Endowed with a pleasing personality and possessed with a rare gift for making friends, Olson as a political campaign manager is admittedly a "scream"; but, prior to his discovery by the governor, no one ever accused him of being timber for the highest court in the state.

It is hardly an exaggeration to state that with a few notable exceptions, every political appointment made by the governor during his tenure of office has been dictated by the same element that made the appointment of Olson possible. Withycombe has been, and if re-elected will continue to be, a rubber stamp for special political interests who have discovered in his easygoing personality and political inexperience, a pliable tool with which to pry loose the political plums. His election in 1914 was an accident and the practical politicians have successfully collected all of the insurance.

OUR UKRAINIANS

One million Ukrainians in the United States and Canada have formed a federation to Americanize their people. At frequent meetings the aims of the allies and the principles of American citizenship are taught. These Ukrainians have given thousands of dollars to our army and bought millions of dollars' worth of Liberty Bonds.

Ukraine in Russia was to feed the Germans, but from across the sea speeds the answer: "The only food Ukraine will give Germany is food for thought."

One million Ukrainian shoulders put to the wheel on which Prussian despotism is slowly being broken.

In the failure of that hope, we may read the failure of all German hopes. Every German conquest, at the moment of realization, like "Dead Sea fruit," turns to bitter ashes in her mouth.

OFFICIAL REGULATIONS CONCERNING XMAS PARCELS

Families of men in service abroad are eager to make Christmas overseas as merry as conditions permit.

The war department, realizing this, has decided that each man may receive from his family a Christmas package of standard size and approximately standard contents.

The American Red Cross will prepare these for mailing, arrangements having been completed between the war department, postoffice department and the Red Cross.

mit the sending of but one parcel to each man.

To avoid any duplication and to make sure that each parcel is correctly addressed, a "Christmas Parcel Label" is now being issued to every man abroad.

Every man abroad will mail his Christmas parcel label to some relative or friend who will be entitled to send him a parcel by complying with the conditions herein set forth.

The relative or friend who receives a Christmas parcel label from an man in overseas service, will apply to the nearest chapter, branch or community

auxiliary of the Red Cross, or to such other Christmas Parcel Station as may be designated by his Red Cross chapter, and upon showing the Christmas parcel label will receive one carton, 3x4x9 inches in size. It will be easy to ascertain from the newspapers whether cartons have been received at the Christmas Parcel Station. Application should not be made until cartons are on hand.

Specially manufactured cartons for this purpose will be sent to chapters from division headquarters, and will be distributed by chapters to branches and community auxiliaries or such

other Christmas Parcel Stations as the chapter may establish, together with Red Cross inspection labels, also furnished from division office.

The carton may be filled with any combination of articles that fit in it and which are not barred from the list of articles that may not be sent which may be procured from the same place as the cartons.

The weight of the parcel must not exceed two pounds 15 ounces unwrapped.

When carton is filled it should be taken to the place where it was procured.

Red Cross representatives will inspect the parcel, and will exclude any article barred by postoffice department from Christmas parcels, remove any notes or messages, wrap, tie and weigh the parcel, place on the parcel the Christmas parcel label received from abroad, bearing name and address of recipient.

The person sending the parcel shall then in the presence of the Red Cross representative, affix stamps at the rate of 12 cents for each pound or fraction thereof (Parcel Post rate to Hoboken, N. J.).

The Red Cross representative who inspected the parcel will then affix to the parcel the Red Cross inspection label, properly signed.

Parcels ready for mailing shall remain in the custody of the Red Cross until delivered by its representatives to the postoffice authorities.

No Christmas Parcels Can Be Mailed Later Than November 15

No Christmas parcel can be accepted by the postoffice without the Christmas parcel label from overseas.

No duplicate can be issued if a Christmas parcel label is lost. This rule cannot be altered by anybody.

These instructions have been issued by National Headquarters of the American Red Cross, are based on the agreement with the War Department and the Postoffice Department, and must therefore be strictly observed.
