**THE DIFFERENCE**

The difference between the West and the Withycombe administration of the state of dollars is not expressed in terms of prison cells. Compared with Governor West, his successor has been inordinately wasteful of the taxpayers' money. The prison has cost \$157,000 more under his "practical" and "business like" methods than it did in West's time.

And there has been continual turmoil among the prisoners with grave accusations of graft against officials. Along those lines the loss to the state is serious. But the loss has been still more serious along another line.

Governor West made a good beginning toward modernizing our prison methods. He guided the institution in the direction of education and reform. He took up the good work of making men out of criminals and carried it so far that the whole state was convinced of the soundness of his plans. Governor Withycombe swept away all of progress that had been made, and, in addition, has frittered away more than \$150,000 of public money in inefficient prison management.—Portland Journal.
