W. R. BILYEU

In presenting the name of W. R. Bilyeu as a candidate for County Judge the Democrat feels that his past record, both in public and private life, is such as to commend his candidacy to the voters of Linn county.

Recognized by both bench and bar as a lawyer of more than ordinary attainments, W. R. Bilyeu is perhaps one of the best known men in Western Oregon.

Having creditably served as a member of the state senate from Linn county for a period of eight years and having also rendered good service as a member of the lower house, Mr. Bilyeu is no stranger to the voters of the county. Perhaps one of the best known pieces of legislation which he was connected with the bill which provided for the payment of Indian War veterans for their services to the state. He was the author of this bill and after a most strenuous fight secured its enactment into law.

While Mr. Bilyeu has been prominently mentioned at various times as a candidate for justice of the supreme court and member of congress from the first congressional district, he has not in later years had any political aspirations. After mature deliberation, however, he consented to accept the nomination as county judge and if elected may be depended upon to render efficient service.

In his formal declaration of candidacy he defines his policy in regard to road matters as follows:

"I favor the maintenance of as many necessary good roads in Linn county as will be consistent with a wise and reasonable economy to the taxpayers and without unjust discrimination."

THE PRESIDENT'S REQUEST

These are some of the lengths to which a group of republican leaders have gone.
