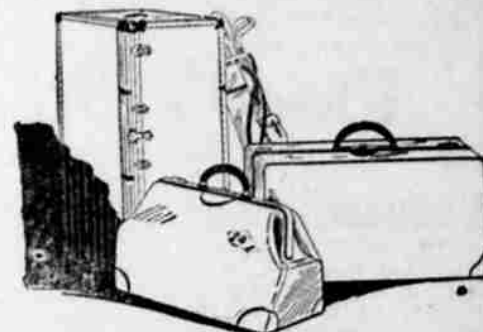

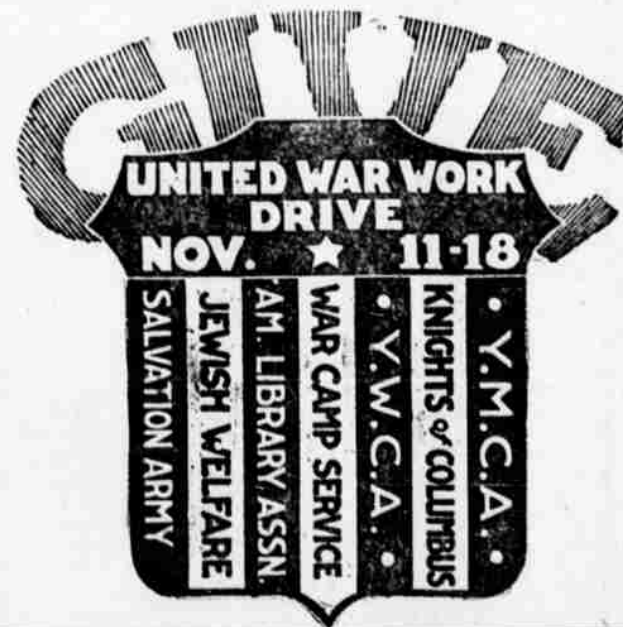
Back of the Firing Line
