PROGRESSIVE PEACE-MAKING

It was a fine thing for the allies
that our enemies yielded one at a time
beginning with the weakest and end-
ing with the strongest. It was much
easier to handle them that way. As
a Washington diplomat remarked
when the German armistice terms
were being arranged:

"We have been getting great prac-
tice. We think of something new to
put in each new armistice as we write.
The one to Germany was a finished
work of military art."

The experience of the allied govern-
ments with Bulgaria, Turkey and Aus-
tria-Hungary not only taught them
the necessary technique, but gave
them a clear idea of how much the
enemy would stand, and what demands
were necessary to impose in order to
bring the carrying out of our peace
program.

Peace-making, like any other activ-
ity, naturally improves with practice.
If we had another enemy to deal with,
we could dictate armistice terms in
our sleep and put them into effect be-
fore breakfast next morning.
