## ULTRA-PARTISANSHIP

The Albany Herald editorially scores Dr. G. H. Young of the Baptist church for a sermon in which he eulogized President Wilson, David Lloyd-George and General Foch. No exception is taken to the words of praise sounded for the leaders of Great Britain and France, but the Herald strongly insists that hereafter the lips of Dr. Young must remain closed as to the achievements of the President of the United States.

Pulpit orators are asked to maintain a dignified silence while "Theodore the Red" and his small but glorious army of satellites are attempting to muddy the waters of diplomacy, belittle the spokesman of the United States government at the most important conference ever held in the history of the world, and withhold credit for achievements which have made President Wilson the dominating figure in the events of the present century.

A few weeks ago the Berlin Tageblatt was making a similar request of the people of Germany. The diplomacy of Woodrow Wilson was breaking down the morale of the men and women of the Central Powers. His unanswerable logic coupled with his sense of exact justice were making an indelible impression upon the German mind and finally forced internal disorders which brought the war to a glorious end, months before a victory could have been won on the field of battle.

Today he is sailing towards France. He is not going as a member of a political party but as the representative of the United States government. He goes first as the champion of American rights and second as the spokesman for international justice which will form a basis for a lasting peace.

There are minds so warped with partisan prejudice and so steeped in their own egotism and selfish political interest that they fail to respond to the call for loyalty to our diplomatic attorney at the peace table; but the great mass of American people, irrespective of party, join with the nations of Europe in hailing him as the greatest statesman and diplomat of ancient or modern times.
