"THE MEN OF THE HOUR—CHRIST'S MEN"

The Secret of the Lord is with them that Fear Him.—Ps. 25:14.
Thy Secret, Lord of Heaven and Earth,
Is with the men who from the birth of their new souls have seen Thy will;
Who shrink not duty's path until, Thy will is done.
These have been given to us four short, beautiful biographies of the Christ. The salient facts of His life have not been lost in a maze of mental peregrinations; but simply, forcefully the fascinating story of the Christ has been recounted for us.
I wish somebody with true knowledge would write for us the biographies of the men of Christ who have been leaders in the world cataclysm that has passed; to give the story of their lives simply; to tell the salient facts that went into the making of their character.
One great fact stands out today above the turmoil and the strife; that fact is the men of the hour upon whom the burdens of the world fell heavily, are Christian men who drew their conquering strength from Christ.
Here are just a few glimpses of some of these men showing what men they really are. Hoover, the food man, with a heart of sympathy and a mind of justice, is a true man from Oregon, whose Christian manhood is of the Quaker type.
Pershing, who when the American lads were ordered to advance, sent his famous message for them to put their trust in Christ as their Savior.
Haig, the great Scotch theologian, in the awful days of last summer, heard a chaplain speak to the men in which he portrayed the cruel crisis went to the chaplain and said, "Have no fear of the outcome for this is God's war."
Wilson, the seer, with international ideals, who when the crisis came upon this land, prayed with his cabinet that the God of nations might direct us; who on May 30th called this nation to repentance and humility that we might do His will.
Lloyd George, who said to an American writer, "Go back and tell your people that we are fighting for the true principles of Christ." He too prays.
And Foch, whom a California boy saw praying for almost an hour, that God would help; who never lets a day pass by without bending the knees to Him who rules the world of struggling, fighting, sinning men. When old Clemenceau, the Tiger of France, looked into Foch's face last summer and saw

Strike That Failed

Labor strikes were frequent even in the earliest recorded days. An important strike occurred in Egypt during the reign of Cheops several thousand years before the Christian era. While the great pyramid erected in honor of that monarch was in course of construction it is stated that 50,000 workmen refused to continue their labors. They were dissatisfied with the food furnished to them, which was insufficient in quantity and poor in quality. Argument proving useless on the part of the contractors, soldiers were ordered to drive the strikers back to work, and many thousands of them were cut to pieces, while those who could escape fled. The others were compelled to resume their labor.

Dogs in Roumania

Each nation has upon the dog in a different way, but the dogs of war and the dogs of peace (of a pastoral) and agricultural people like the Roumanians are beyond doubt the intellectual of their kind. New Alloy of Great Value

On account of the high temperature required for suitably hardening fine-edged tools of tungsten high-speed steel, Sheffield tool-makers have sought a substitute material. A new alloy produced by adding cobalt to chromium-carbon steel is reported to be best hardening at a temperature not exceeding 1,200 C. For most purposes the hardening needed is obtained when the tool is cooled naturally in draft-free air. In a comparative test series of "cobalt iron," as the new steel is called, continued cutting four days without regrinding, while saws of tungsten high-speed steel were dulled in two days and those of carbon-steel in half a day.

German War Gardens

In the German army, as in the American, garden patches supplemented the food ration. German military garb in the restaurant salient, however, were so numerous and of such size that the impression the Americans got was that the German soldiers in this sector depended largely for food upon what they themselves produced and upon what was grown by the French natives forced to work in the fields for three sous an hour.

Our captives include several thousand acres of gardens, and although it is rather late in the season, the pickings will be far from poor for many resourceful mess sergeants.—Stars
