An Open Letter to Prospective Students

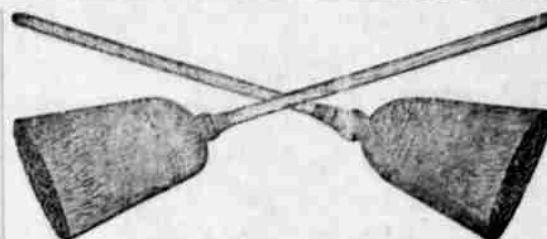
