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BOEHM WARNS AGAINST HEAVY EXPENDITURES FOR MILITARY AND NAVY

People Must Be Unburdened From War Expenses as Rapidly as Possible, He Says.

WASHINGTON, Jan. 14.—Attacking Sen. Daniels' "biggest navy" program, Senator Borah today warned that "this shameful orgy of expenditure may force the people to cry out with the voice of revolution against the madness that is grinding them to powder."

He charged that while in theory the government has great plans for universal peace and brotherhood, "nevertheless in practice it still apparently is following the rules of kings and autocrats—to frighten the people and rob them through taxation."

The "political influence" now epidemic in Russia may infect America if more attention is not paid to those who must pay the taxes, Borah said.

"I serve notice now that those who undertake to put through this naval program will have to fight every step of the way," said Borah. "I cannot understand the demand for warships at this time. They are instruments of war. Are we challenging or throwing doubt upon the friendship of France or England? Japan is powerful but our relations are friendlier than for a decade."

"After the war is over with our enemies defeated and all the great naval powers friendlier than ever before, we propose to spend \$600,000,000 in three years on a powerful fighting machine."

"Is this not a direct challenge to the good faith of our allies, or does it not throw doubt on the sincerity of our own professions?"

"Above all, is it not a signal act of injustice to the people of this country who have paid taxes and brought liberty bonds and saved, stunted and denied themselves in the war crisis?"

"Is the American taxpayer to have no more place in this program than a coddled peon?"

"Are we going on with this shameless orgy of expenditure until the people are forced to cry out with the voice of revolution against the madness that is grinding them to powder?"

"The next war will not be between governments nor nations, but between the governments and the people. The French and Russian revolutions are the legitimate outgrowth of injustice in the last six months that did not have its parent in the oppression of the bloody Romanoffs. We cannot shoot up or kill that kind of movement. You have to feed Russia on something besides bullets. That is what the Romanoffs fed the Russians. America should adopt a different plan."

"I know we are very strong, well-poised liberty-loving people, but we are not immune. The shameless waste of the people's earnings, the unconscionable extortion from their savings will undermine the noblest institution. Even the structure reared by our fathers will not stand the strain indefinitely."

"The people have patiently borne the burdens of war. But expenditures from now on must be based on reason and distributed with economy."

Borah quoted reports of children starving in New York. Half the story was not told, he said, adding he had reports from another city showing 100,000 children to be undernourished and underfed.

"These are the seeds of Bolshevism," said Borah. "How quickly this political influenza will spread when once hatched in hives of misery and starvation no one can tell. Now it is time to take notice, to consider the people who have to pay the taxes."

HUNS STARTED TO ROOF OVER SEA

LONDON, Jan. 14.—U. P.—The Germans built great train sheds in the water to shelter the subs at Brugge, from bombs dropped from the air.

The sheds have concrete roofs 11 feet thick and are of massive proportions. From early in '17 until the Huns abandoned Brugge, 4,000 workmen were employed in building the great sheds. Hundreds of pillars, each two feet thick and 25 feet high, supported the roof. Eight shutters had been completed and the ninth was going up when the Germans decided to chase back home.

In the early war days they clearly planned the harbors at Zeebrugge and Ostend as permanent bases. The original boats were built at the Hoboken Works, near Antwerp.

Owing to offensive naval operations off the Belgian coast, assisted by aircraft, the harbors became unsuitable for such fragile craft and after May, 1916, the large floating docks at Ostend were towed around to Zeebrugge and so up to Brugge.

Some idea of the severity of the attacks may be gained from the fact that no less than 6123 bombs were dropped by the British upon Brugge docks alone, while a similar number were posted upon Zeebrugge and Ostend.
