Whatever happens to the railroads, one thing is certain: They must not be allowed to go back to the old mess.

Americans are a long-suffering people. They have stood for abuses in public utilities which it seems incredible that any people should stand who have in their own hands the power to remedy them.

The chaotic duplication of stations and express companies which was allowed to go on beside the equally chaotic lack of stations and express facilities is finally being straightened out under governmental control.

Just what will be done with the roads, just what ought to be done with them, is still an open question. But this is sure—trains must not be allowed to run backward into confusion, extravagance and inefficiency.
