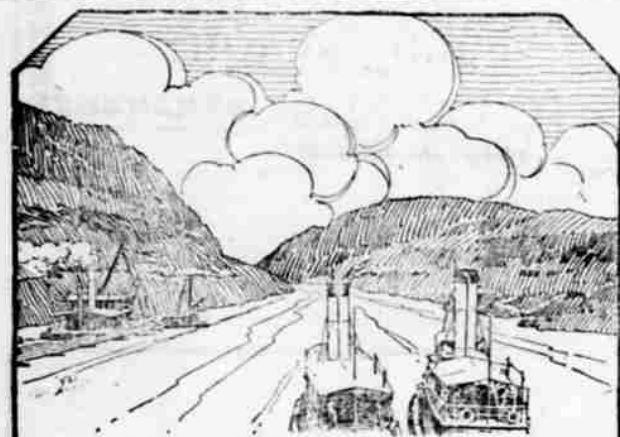
O. A. C., Jan. 15.—Special.—The first official registration figures have been given out at the college, the registration up to Tuesday morning being 1271, with several hundred students yet to come. The registration is divided as follows: agriculture, 249; commerce, 249; engineering, 306; forestry, 22; home economics, 373; pharmacy, 68; optional, 4. The total registration for the school year is 2956, no duplications included. This includes 2196 new students and 678 old students the first term, and 82

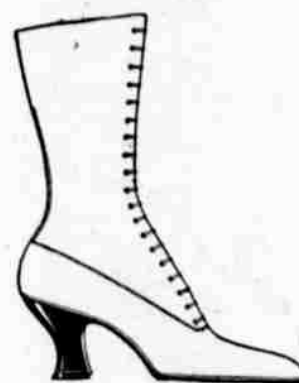

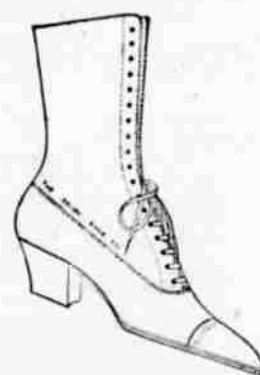

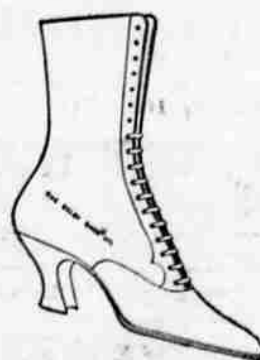
