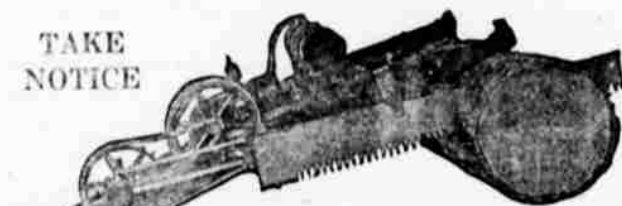

Sabotage Bill Passed

by Legislature

SALEM, Jan. 17.—By U. P.—The senate this afternoon passed Dimick's criminal syndicalism sabotage bill 29 to 1. The one vote against was that of Pierce, who tried to have it postponed.

Vigorous warnings were voiced by Senators Dimick, Eddy and Moser that action must be taken to meet the spread of Bolshevism.

JOSEPH PATTERSON CITED FOR BRAVERY

Man Well Known in Albany and Newport Commended for Gallantry in Action

PARIS.—Special by Mail.—Lieutenant Joseph Patterson of Pittsburg, Pa., formerly of Portland, Or., has won a citation of appreciation from the United States army for his work in caring for wounded under fire as liaison officer of the American Red Cross attached to the 305th Sanitary Train. The formal expression was made by Major Charles H. Lewis, U. S. A., commanding officer of the 305th Sanitary Train, and it cites the section of the Red Cross field service which advanced with the fighting forces shortly before the armistice was signed and specifically singles out Lieutenant Patterson for personal mention.

Major Lewis' formal communication to the headquarters in Paris reads: "This division now being in rest area after a period of continuous action at the front, advantage is taken of the opportunity to compliment the Red Cross for the excellent service rendered to this organization (the 305th sanitary train) and to the wounded of whom it took care. Your lieutenant, Joseph Patterson, by his work has merited for your organization this expression of appreciation."

Prior to the United States' entrance into the war Lieut. Patterson served with the American ambulance service and was a member of a section several times cited.

Lieutenant Patterson was formerly a member of the reportorial staff of The Oregonian and is well known in Portland and in Albany, Corvallis and Newport. He volunteered in 1915 to serve with the American field ambulance service and for about a year was on the Verdun front, during much of the heavy fighting. Upon the United States' entry into the war he returned to the United States and attended an aviation officers' training camp, but before completion of his training was commissioned lieutenant by the American Red Cross and sent back to France as liaison officer. Because of his previous experience he was hurried to the front and saw some of the spirited action just preceding the armistice.

Before returning to France Mr. Patterson visited in Portland and the theft from his hotel of a German helmet, a battle trophy, resulted in the internment of two alien enemies. The maid at the hotel who later confessed to taking the helmet for sentimental reasons hid it in a German Lutheran church and planned to sell it at one of the benefit bazaars. Her confessions involved herself and a man and both were interned.—Oregonian.
