REBUILDING FACES

War, which has shown to the world so many refinements in the art of killing, has been characterized also by the greatest strides in the cure and prevention of disease, and the treatment of wounds.

All maiming and hurts are hard to bear, but there is perhaps nothing so dreadful to the sufferer as those which result in final disfigurement of the face. It is accepted that not all may be beautiful, but to be horrible tears the heart of observer and observed.

Of all hurts those to face and mouth are most difficult of treatment, owing to the practical impossibility of holding the mouth and jaw immovable during operation and subsequent healing.

The new device is called "jaw lock" and is attached to upper and lower teeth, permitting liquid foods to be introduced between the parts of the brace.
