THE NEW MENACE

Prussianism is ended for all time, but the evil that it sowed in a final desperate effort to save itself threatens to yield a poisonous crop in the countries that conquered Prussianism.

Yet not only in France and in England but even in this country the Bolshevik idea has taken root; and it must be combated with the same determination to destroy it that has animated the American people in their fight against Prussianism.

At a mass meeting of socialists in Chicago, attended by about 10,000 American citizens, most of whom bore either German or Russian names, the speakers declared their sympathy with the allied and American troops in Siberia for disarming the Siberian Soviets, and proclaimed the red flag of the International, the flag to which—rather than to the American flag—all good socialists owed allegiance.

It is the purpose of the Industrial Workers of the World, the Bolshevik Socialists and those Americans who have been pro-German in the past to deliver this country over to anarchy. They will not succeed, but they will make trouble. And we may expect that in their efforts they will receive underground aid and encouragement from Germany.
