TRUTHS FROM HOOVER

There has been manifested in congress opposition to President Wilson's recent appeal for \$100,000,000 for food relief abroad.

The fact of the case is, the situation abroad is so desperate that if those who have food to spare do not act

on the principle of the relief committee in New York, which said, "we will feed the children first, and then investigate," millions of little children and their mothers, and even the soldiers of our allies themselves, are going to starve to death. To prove these statements, here are some results of Hoover's investigations:

In Finland the peasants are mixing bread flour with straw. They have no fats, meats and sugar, and the Bolsheviks are always with them.

Serbia has a bread ration of three ounces a day. Has anybody forgotten how Serbia, like Belgium, rose from her ashes and reentered the war?

The Balkan states have only food for one or two months more.

Roumania will starve inside 30 days. Poland and Czechoslovakia are full of children already dying for lack of fats, butter and milk.

There is plenty of time later to find out how necessary our contributions are, and how honestly they are administered, but the relief is imperative. While the republican leaders are playing politics, the innocent are starving. The amounts which we are

to furnish are "the smallest possible to sustain life." Does that sound as though we are being gouged or cheated?
