ARE THEY FOR BONDS?

Never was a finer meeting held in Linn county for any purpose than the gathering which assembled at Lebanon last night to hear discussions on good roads. The people of Lebanon exerted themselves to make the occasion one worth remembering, and they accomplished the result. It was splendid in every way. The spirit of the people from all sections of the county reflected by the delegates present shows plainly that Linn county is for good roads. Never again let it be said that Linn is one of the safe remaining seats of mossbackism.

The fact developed that there is no question as to whether or not good roads are wanted, but how to get them. Some favor direct taxes and building a little as we go, while the vast majority in the county are for good roads that they can use during their own lifetime and enjoy as they go, and these people are for a bond issue.

The committee appointed at the recent meeting in this county has decided that \$600,000 is the amount to issue at this time, or to be exact, to vote at this time and issue during the next two or three years. Commissioner Butler says that amount will care for about 600 miles of roads under the committee's plan. The tax on the average property to pay the interest

and principal on these bonds will be so small that it will not be felt.

But the meeting last night brought out the fact that there is but little opposition to the bonds, and once all understand the proposition the vote on June 3 will be unanimous.

The Lebanon people were wonderful hosts. They did everything in their power for the comfort and pleasure of their guests. About 20 good citizens voluntarily surrendered their tickets to visitors and went home to eat a cold lunch and return in time for the speaking. That is the spirit that will win and there is no holding Lebanon back from further development, once they get their road out to the Pacific Highway and then on over the mountains into Eastern Oregon.

It was a fine meeting, well attended and well handled.

There is still time to plant that berry or vegetable patch and make a profit this year and a bigger profit next year. Keep Linn county on the map by making this the small fruits paradise of the United States. Let Linn county products be known all over the world. Plant and grow enough of the right kind of products and the future will care for itself. With small tracts ripening into red berries every year, in a few years Albany will be a bustling community of 25,000 people, and every section of the county will grow in proportion.

What are we going to do about the Victory Loan? The drive starts next week and Linn county is not ready. Are we going over the top before any other county in the state, and is Oregon going to maintain her national reputation in this drive? It means that a lot of work has yet to be done this week. The drive proper opens on April 21, but all of next week should be put in preparatory licks.

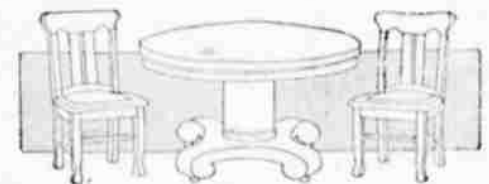
